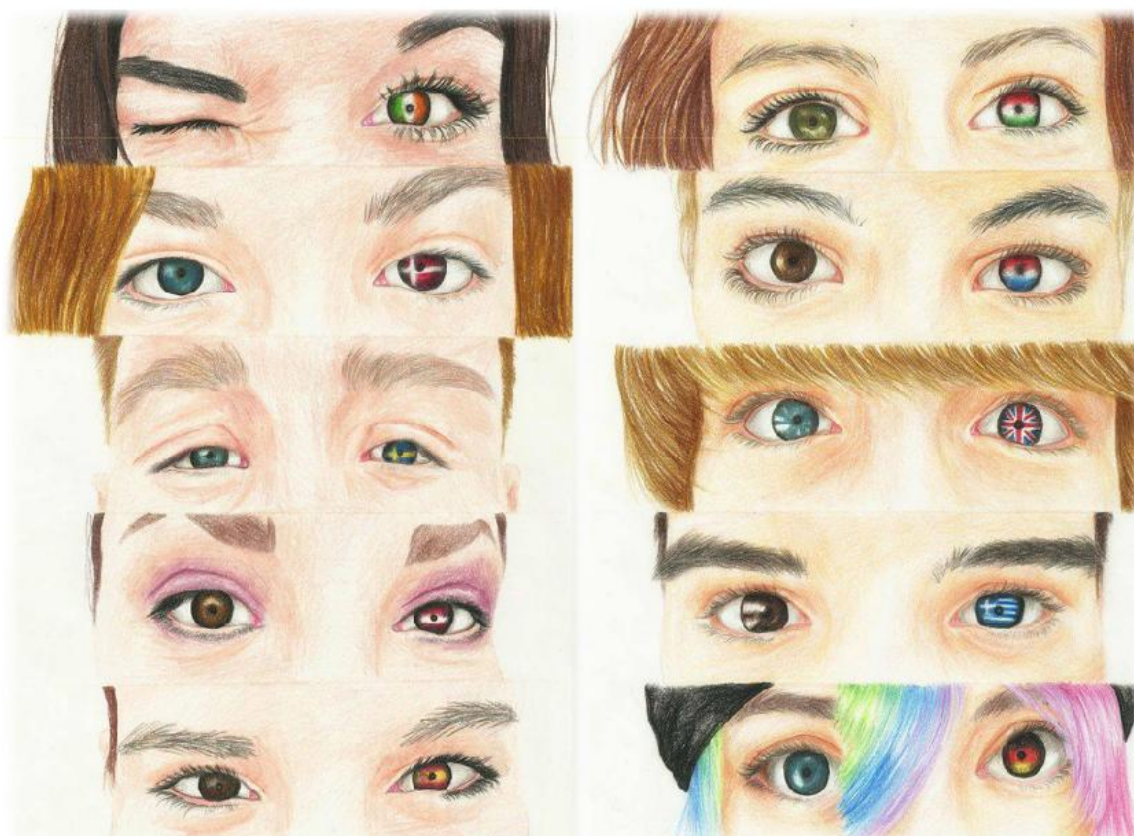

The Jean Monnet Project “Universities4EU”

Description

The Jean Monnet Project “Universities4EU-U4EU” has been approved by the European Commission to be implemented from the University of Piraeus, represented by its Rector Professor Nikolaos Georgopoulos during the academic years 2014-16. The Academic Coordinator of the Project is Dr. Foteini Asderaki, Assistant Professor of the Department of the International and European Studies, School of Economic, Business and International Studies, University of Piraeus, Greece.



Aims & special objectives of the project

Universities4EU (U4EU) eagered to adjust the information on EU issues towards youngsters through innovative ways of learning, interactive processes, new media tools and especially adjusted EU material taking into consideration the respective educational perceptions in Greek secondary and vocational education schools.

The succeeded objectives of the program were:

- a) to inform youngsters and citizens on the rights and opportunities that EU offers and raise awareness on EU integration issues
- b) to develop synergies within different level of education (higher and secondary) and types of institutions in order to conduct activities and spread information on EU affairs
- c) to give the opportunity for interaction among a variety of institutions (universities, vocational, intercultural, evening and general Lyceums, national

and local educational authorities, municipalities, NGOs, European Institutions in Greece, Europe direct, etc) and actors (academics, students, teachers, pupils, youth workers, civil servants).

d) to train teachers and pupils and provide them with educational material adapted to their needs

e) to exploit the existing EU material such as Teachers' Corner, ECB's Euro School and apply open sources such as open education europa, Europeana, europarlament tv, etc.

f) to provide innovative tools developed to address the needs of youngsters in order to assist them better understand EU and its core policies and values, such as the Floor Game, and the application for tablet and mobile devices.

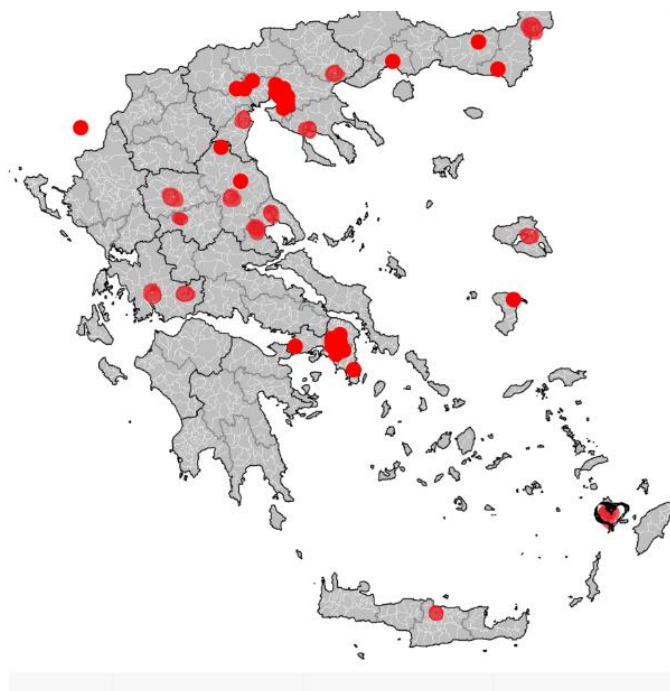
g) to enhance the interaction and cooperation between the civil society (Youth NGOs), higher education (University of Piraeus & University of Aegean) and School Education (vocational and secondary education) in order to fuel a fruitful dialogue on current issues influenced by the crisis (i.e. youth unemployment, social inequalities, disinterest on civic affairs)

h) to elaborate proposals addressed to the policy-makers in order to enhance EU dimension within the curricula.

Moreover, the scientific team decided to conduct research using questionnaires to explore the youngsters' EU perception.

Selection of the Participants

The Academic Coordinator submitted all the necessary documents to the Directorate of Studies of the Greek Ministry of Education, Research and Religious Affairs in order to acquire a special permission to organise the training activities for Lyceums. In January 2015, an open call was published via the Ministry of Greece. Seventy (70) applications were received from both General and Vocational Lyceums from all over Greece and from one Greek school located in Albania. There was not any application for the Region of Peloponnese due to the late spread of information by the relevant authorities.



Locations of the applicants

The selection criteria included a letter of interest where previous participation in various European programmes was described; schools also expressed their interest for organising educational activities concerning EU. After a tough pre-selection, as the majority of the applications were of an excellent quality, a positive answer was sent to forty three (43) schools from fifteen (15) different cities of Greece and in particular from Athens, Piraeus, Tilos, Thessaloniki, Larisa, Giannitsa, Chalkidiki, Kavala, Alexandroupoli, Iasmos, Orestiada, Chios, Veroia, Kranea, Triglia; a Greek school from Mesopotamos (Albania) was also included. The selection rational was based on the geographical diversity (Central, West, North, South Eastern Greece) and the variety of the type selected schools (public, private, model experimental, evening, intercultural from both general and vocational Secondary Education). Moreover, the scientific and project team had several discussions on how the project could have a major societal impact. Thus, an attempt was made to include as many schools as possible in each city so as to give the opportunity to more pupils and teachers to be actively engaged in EU issues.

Preparatory activities (January 2015)

Meeting with the team

The Academic Coordinator had several preparatory meetings with the project and scientific team during the period of January 2015 in order to organize the academic/training and operational part of the project. Moreover, youth NGOs were invited to discuss and participate in the workshops' design such as AIESEC Piraeus, AEGEE Athina, AEGEE Piraeus, JEF Piraeus, United Societies of Balkans, Erasmus Student's Network Greece, European Voluntary Service, Center for Promotion of Youth Entrepreneurship & Technology, Unesco Youth Club Thessaloniki and two youth groups from the University of Piraeus, the "MUN" and the Research Group on Rhetorical Communication and Persuasion. An experienced workshop facilitator and former student of the DIES coordinated these activities.



The representatives of the youth NGOs along with the team of “Universities4EU” played for the first time the floor game at the end of the first preparatory meeting. (Please read more about the floor game at the chapter “Deliverables”)

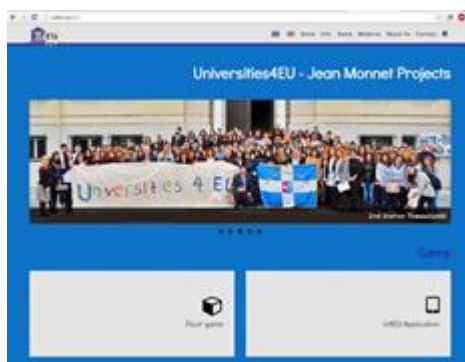
Visual Identity

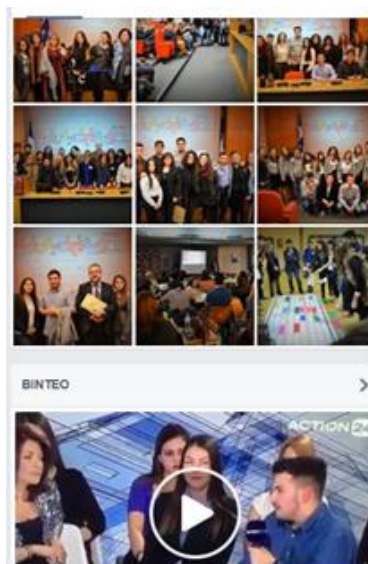

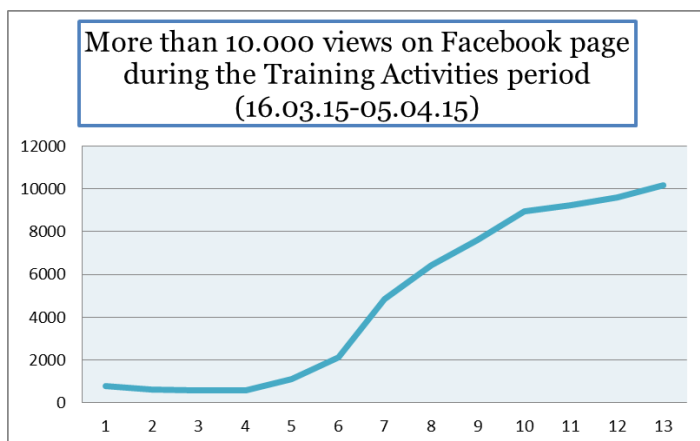

“Universities4EU” Training and Dissemination Activities

Eight (8) events took place in the framework of the project

1. One-day Training Seminar, Piraeus 21.03.2015
2. One-day Training Seminar, Thessaloniki 28.03.2015
3. One-day Training Seminar, Kavala, 30.03.2015
4. Two-days Dissemination and Scientific Conference- Athens and Piraeus 04-05.12.2015
5. One-day Training Seminar- General Private Lyceum “Othisi”, 24.04.15
6. One-day Training Seminar- 7th General Lyceum, Athens, 6.05.2015
7. One-day Dissemination activity- General Lyceum of Thrakomakedones 7.05. 2015
8. Three-days Dissemination and Training Seminar- Middle and Upper School of Tilos 9-12.05.2015

In total 1139 participants took part in the 8 events organized in the framework of the project.

“Universities4EU” Training Seminars & Workshops

Universities4EU seminars and workshops for teachers and pupils took place in, March 2015 in three (3) different cities of Greece (Piraeus, Thessaloniki and Kavala) with the active participation of forty-three (43) schools. They included both theoretical and empirical parts within workshops. The design of all the activities was under the consideration of the “Euro sceptical” societal environment that the severe economic crisis had created in Greece.

The theoretical part

The theoretical part of the Project was implemented by academics from the University of Piraeus and the University of Aegean, along with postgraduate and undergraduate students.

1. History of the EU –EU as the peace maker and the stabilizer of the European continent
2. Greek participation in the EU and current challenges
3. EU governance and institutions – European Citizenship
4. The European Monetary Union and the current Economic Crisis
5. European educational programs and initiatives for young people and teachers (Erasmus +, Youth on the Move)

The four (4) Workshops

1. “Stay Active - Europe is U”

"Stay Active, EUROPE is U" workshop conducted by AEGEE and JEF; the workshop aimed to help young pupils to get in touch with the idea of Europe and to get familiarized with the on-going policy making procedure through active participation. 2. “EU Simulation Exercise”

This workshop, conducted by the MUN team and the Rhetorical Communication and Persuasion Groups of University of Piraeus, simulated the “Ordinary Legislative Procedure” of the Council. In order to make clear how the EU institutions legislate, a European Commission’s, a Council of Ministers’ and a European Parliament Committee’s session have been simulated. Pupils were asked to play the roles of Commissioners, Ministers of Member-States or Members of the European Parliament, so as to understand in practice the complicated legislative procedure. Leaflets and instructions were prepared and distributed in advance of the workshop so as the pupils would be prepared regarding the role of the European institutions, the legislative procedures of the EU and the compromises that should be made among various actors in order to have a positive outcome.



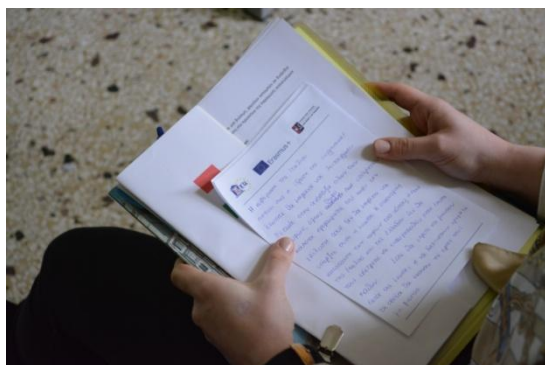

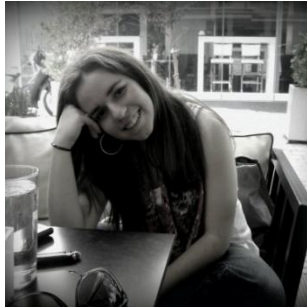
The workshop's impact

4. The Floor Game U4EU: Euro-Euro Oloi

Parallel Sessions for Teachers

During the parallel sessions for teachers, the teachers had the chance to get familiarized with various EU topics concerning Secondary Education. The main training thematics were the European Educational Policy, Multilingualism and the opportunities of the new European programme, Erasmus +. Moreover, the development of knowledge alliances within institutions of different educational levels was discussed.

Teachers were trained in order to be well educated on the issues of European integration; promote pupils' creativity and organization of activities related to the EU; to participate in an active network for exchanging views and best practices in education within the EU; to act like multipliers within their schools. Most of the participating schools submitted proposals in the framework of Erasmus + (2015) and some of them managed to be accepted.

Tilos is one of the Dodecanese islands; its population amounts to 533 people. The island has three small cities: the Grand Village with 233 inhabitants, Livadia with 278 inhabitants and St. Anthony with 22 inhabitants. Tilos has many archaeological monuments.



Tilos became known in 1970 when Professor Nikolaos Simeonides discovered in a cave, in the region of Myssarias, a cemetery dwarf elephants which were isolated in the island after the precipitation of Aegeis, whose peaks make up the current Aegean archipelago.



The Middle-Upper School of Tilos is located at Livadia. Twenty two pupils attended all the six grades, ten of them the three last grades.

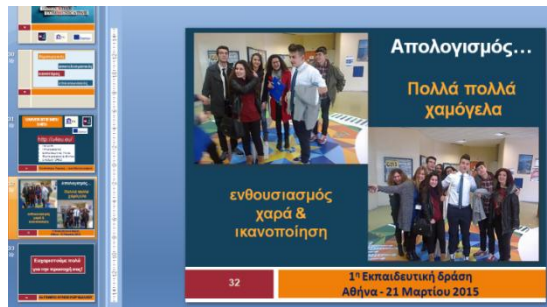

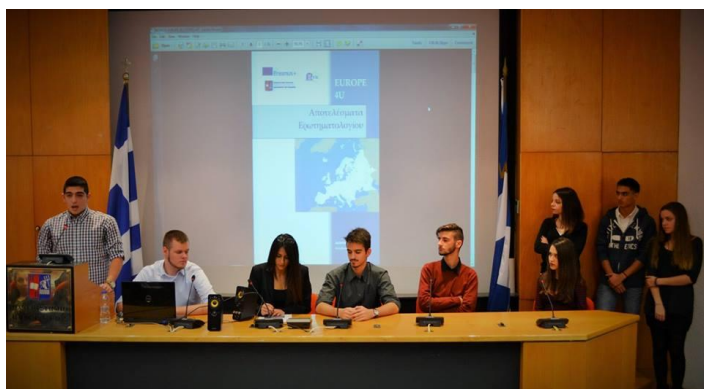

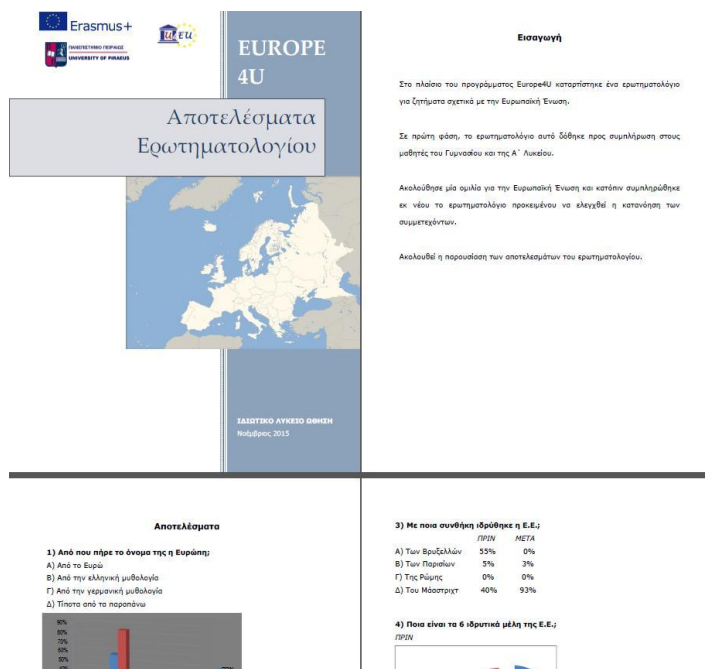

Παρατηρήσεις

Η Νέα Τρίγλια ανήκει στο Δήμο Ν. Προποντιδής της Χαλκίδας και βρίσκεται σε απόσταση περίπου 35 - 40 χλμ. από τον Πολύγυρο, όπου η έδρα της Διεύθυνσης Δευτεροβάθμιας Εκπαίδευσης Ν. Χαλκίδας. Η Ν. Τρίγλια - και η γύρω περιοχή της - είναι κυρίως αγροτική, αλλά περιλαμβάνει ημεδαπικές και τουριστικές παρалаλές ζώνες.

Το Γενικό της Λύκειο έχει κατ' εώς ένα δωδεκάμηνο μαθητών που κυμαίνεται από 140 έως 157 μαθητές και εξυπηρετεί μαθητές από την ίδια τη Ν. Τρίγλια, αλλά και από τα χωριά της γύρω περιοχής. Πιο συγκεκριμένα, εξυπηρετεί τους μαθητές από: Ν. Τεσλό, Ν. Τρίγλια, Ν. Φιλότυπο, Ελευσίονα, Πετρίονα, Κρήνη. Το σχολείο λειτουργεί πλήρως με 6 τμήματα Γενικής Παιδείας (2 τμήματα ανά Τάξη) και 6 τμήματα Κατεχόμενων, Θεωρητικής, Θετικής, Τεχνολογικής (3 τμήματα στη Β Λυκείου και 3 στη Γ Λυκείου). Συμπαραματικά, το ΓΕΛ της Ν. Τρίγλιας είναι ένα εξωτερικό και λειτουργικό Λύκειο.

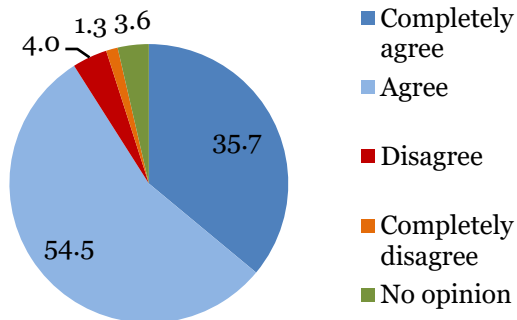

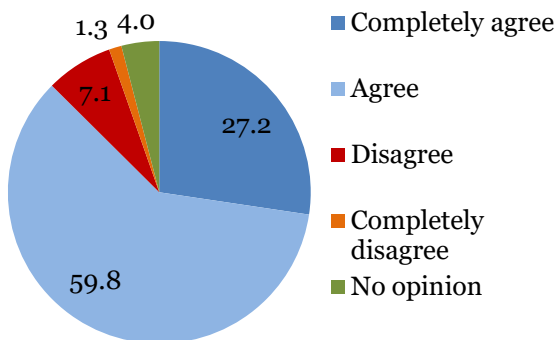

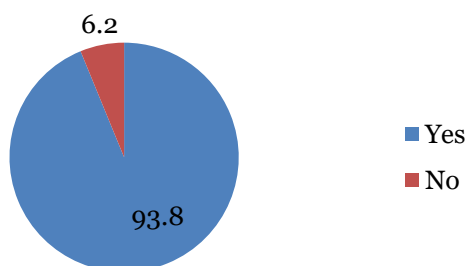

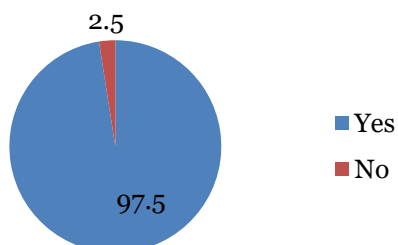

Deliverables

Floor Game

The “Floor game” was created in the framework of Universities4EU and became one of the four workshops that were available for pupils during the seminars of the project. More than 700 people participated in this game in Athens, Piraeus, Thessaloniki, Kavala and Tilos.



The creators of the game were Kostas Synodinos, International Relations Expert, Department of DIES, Panteion University Philippos Kuhn, Graphic Designer, Technological Educational Institute of Athens and Dimitris Stratakis, Department DIES, University of Piraeus, Master in Peace and Development Studies, University of Linnaeus, Sweden.



Two round floor games were actually created. Pupils contributed to the final creation and configuration of the Game and in the final name of it. In this cooperative game, the twelve players of each team were trying to end as much as possible is closer to the center of the game, which represents the European Union, and in a better time than the other team which play the same game next to them. The game is organized by a broadcaster who knows the rules, holds the cards of questions and makes the questions and motivates players to work together. The aim of the game is that students gain knowledge about the European Union, and understand the concept of European cooperation and

integration. During the dissemination conference, pupils had the chance to play again with the game and propose potential names for it. After many suggestions and upon voting the name that was chosen was “Euro-Euro Oloi”. The winning idea came from pupils of the Private Lyceum of Othisi and of the General Lyceum of Thrakomakedones.

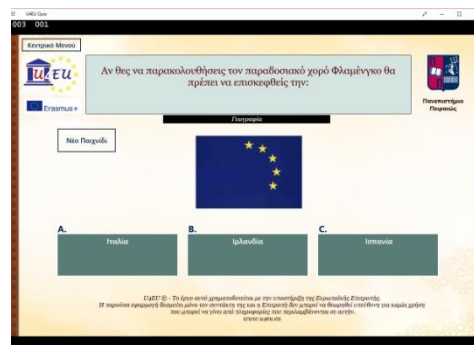
Application for Mobile and Tablet Devices

In the framework of the project an application for tablets was created by Panagiotis Kyrillos, undergraduate students from the Department of Digital Systems, University of Piraeus.

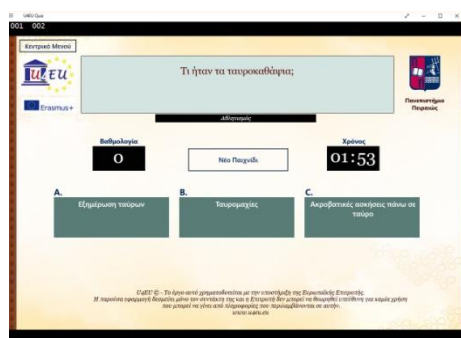

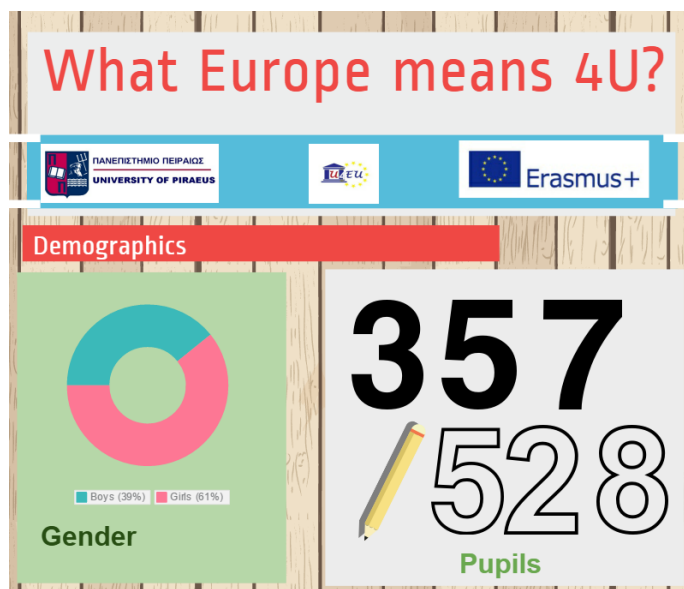

Research “What Europe means 4U”

The objective of the research was to explore and find out the opinions of pupils regarding EU, what EU means for them, the effect of gender on views of the European Union and to comprehend whether pupils are optimistic or pessimistic regarding the EU's future.



For the needs of the survey, questionnaires were used including a predefined series of questions used to collect information from pupils. The questionnaires included open-ended and close-ended questions and were distributed to pupils before each training activity of the project. The

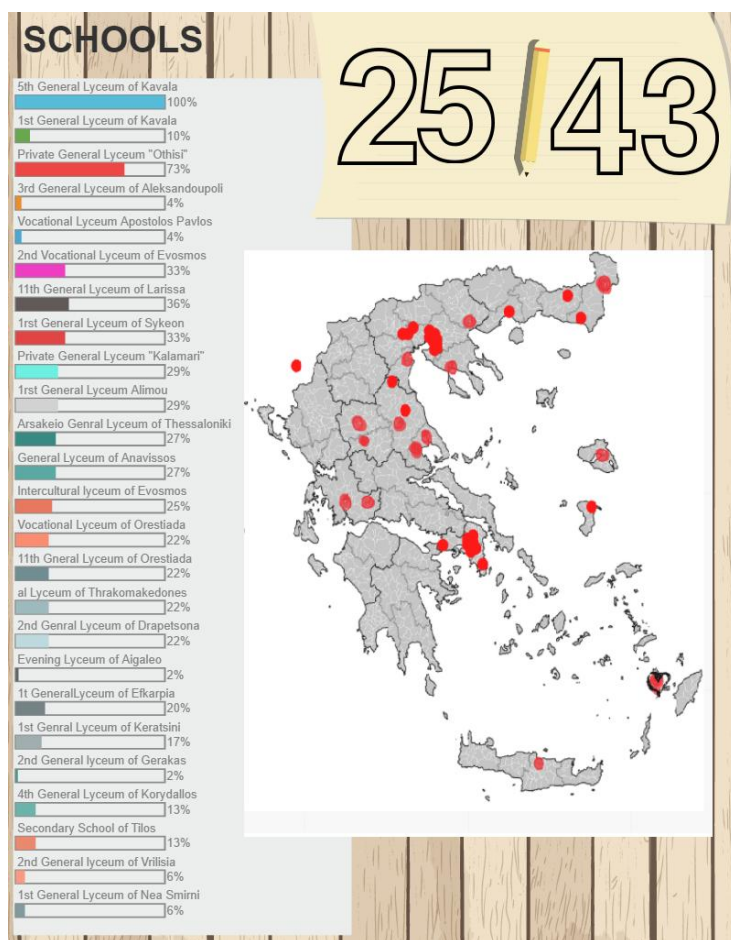
Academic Coordinator presented the results of the research “What Europe means 4U?” that was conducted by the scientific team of the project on 4th of December, the first day of the Dissemination Conference, which took place at the Office of the European Parliament in Greece. The results of the research were also presented under the title "Europe through the students' eyes", in the conference "Greece and the European Union: Learning from

the past, shaping the future", on the occasion of Europe's Day, organized by the EuropeDirect information centres of ELIAMEP, Athens Municipality and the Athens Chamber of Commerce and Industry on Wednesday, May 13, 2015, Athens Byzantine and Christian Museum. In addition, the results were also presented in conference of Education and Art, "Painting Greece", in the Athens Municipality Arts Center, April 30, 2015.

Description of the sample of the research

In the research they took part 357 pupils from 25 Lyceums. The 60.8% of the participants were females and 39.2% males. The following schools took part in the research: 5th General Lyceum of Kavala (12,6%), 1st General Lyceum of Kavala (12,3%), Othisi School (9,2%), 3rd Lyceum of Alexandroupoli (5,0%), Private School "Kollegio Pnoi Agapis", Albania (5,0%), 2nd Vocational Lyceum of Evosmos (4,5%), 11th General Lyceum of Larissa (4,5%), 1st General Lyceum of Sykees (4,2%), General Lyceum "Hellenic French School of Kalamari" (3,6%), 1st General

Lyceum of Alimos (3,6%), General Lyceum "Arsakeia-Tositseia Schools of Thessaloniki", (3,4%), General Lyceum of Anavissos (3,4%), Intercultural Lyceum of Evosmos (3,1%), 1st Vocational Lyceum of Orestiada (2,8%), 4th General Lyceum of Zografou (2,8%), General Lyceum of Thrakomakedones (2,8%), 2nd General Lyceum of Drapetsona (2,8%), Evening General Lyceum of Egaleo (2,5%), General Lyceum of Efkarpia (2,5), 1st General Lyceum of Keratsini (2,2%), 1st General Lyceum of Gerakas

Opinions of Pupils Regarding EU

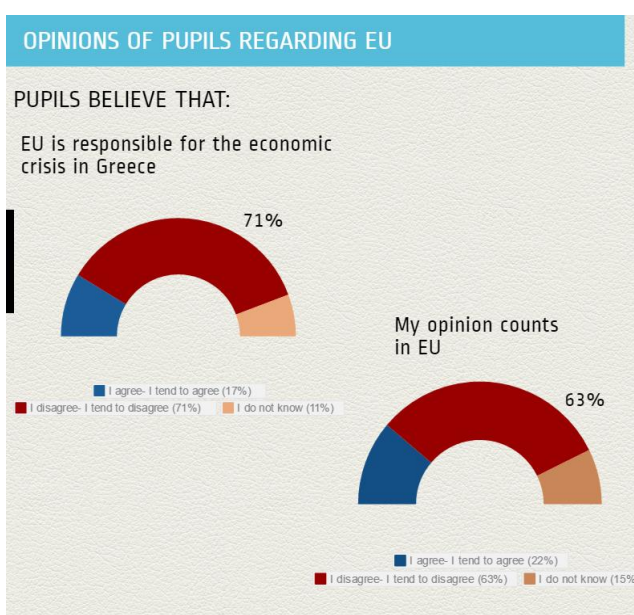
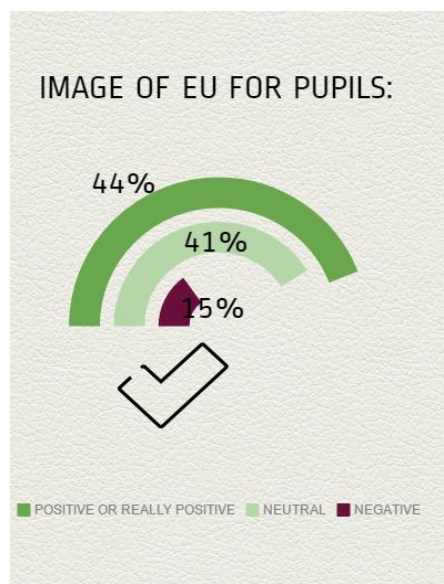
The questionnaires were divided in five sub topics: personal data concerning age and gender; EU perception; Globalisation and the role of EU for its citizens; the future of Europe; Greece and EU. Pupils were asked to indicate whether they agree or not on a 5-point Likert scale, with certain predetermined concepts.

The vast majority of students (90.8%) agreed that the European Union means freedom to travel, study and work anywhere in EU. Almost 80.0% of pupils agreed that the European Union means peace, the 75.4% of pupils that it means cultural heritage and the 71.2% of pupils that it means democracy.

In an effort to pool the opinions of students about the European Union, we applied the multivariate technique of factorial analysis. They emerged three statistically significant factors explain nearly 57.0% of the total variance.

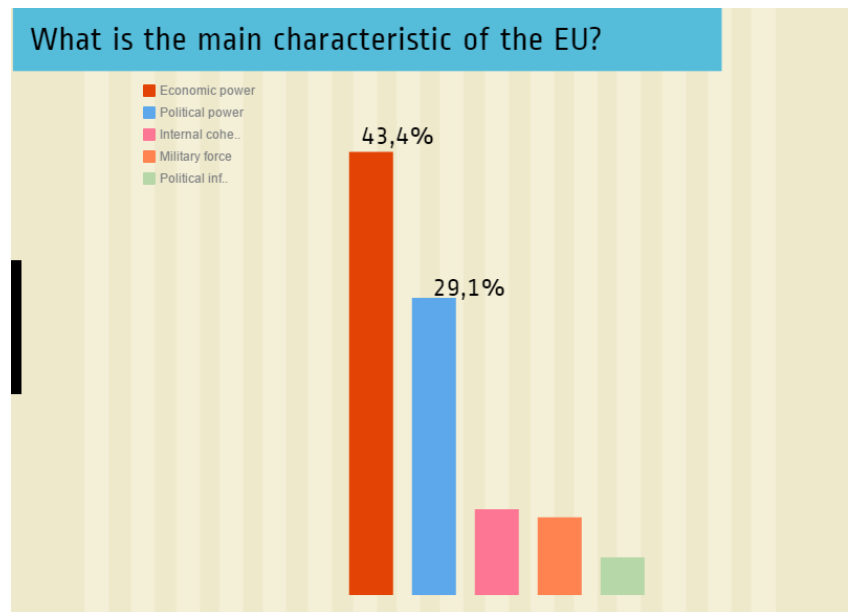
For 41.2% of the sample, the European Union has a neutral image. For 44.0% of pupils EU has a positive or very positive image while 14.9% of pupils have a negative or very negative image.

50.7% of the respondents think that the Greek membership of the

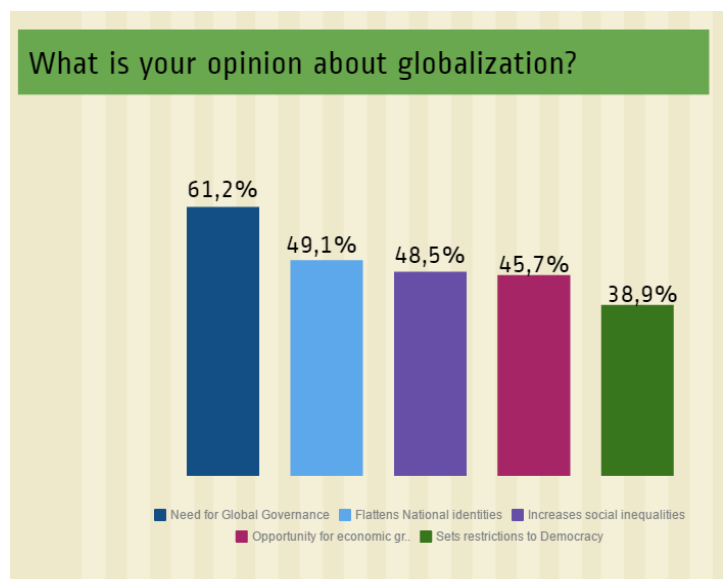


EU positive or very positive for Greece. A percentage of 34.7% of the respondents think that the participation of Greece is neutral while 14.6% think it is negative or very negative. The 71.2% disagreed with the fact that the EU is responsible for the economic crisis in Greece. Finally, the 63.0% disagreed that they are well informed about EU issues.

We observed that in terms of priority and significance, the pupils believe that the "economic power" (43.4%) is the element that best characterizes the European Union. The 29.1% of pupils chose "political influence" as important and 29.4% as less important. Finally, 3.7% of pupils chose "military power" as a major and 9.0% as less important.



The 45.7% of pupils agreed with the fact that globalization is an opportunity for economic development. The percentage of 46.5% agreed the fact that globalization increases social inequalities. The 61.2% agree that globalization requires common global rules (global governance). For 38.9% globalization limits

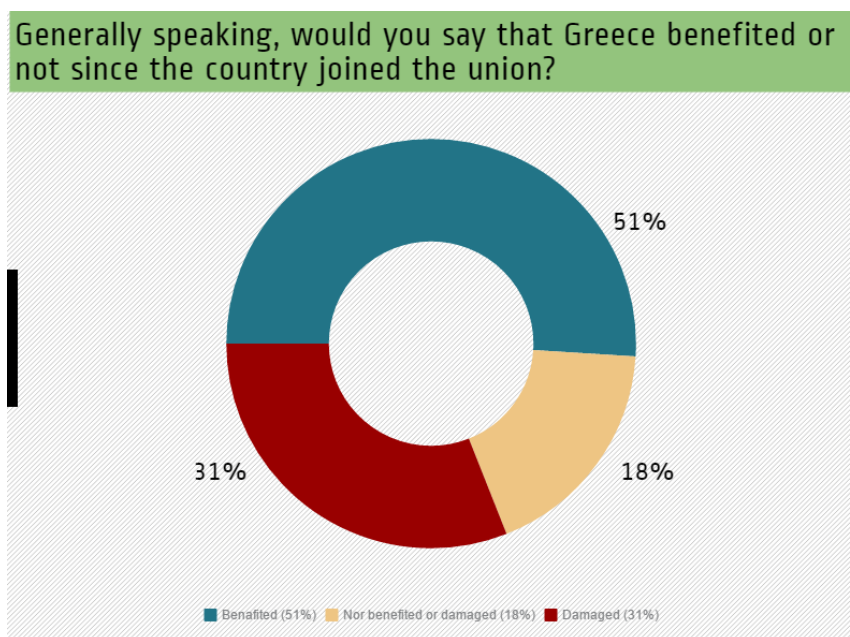


democracy - the possibility for citizens to exercise control. The 49.1% agreed that globalization flattens national identities. The percentage of 40.3% was neutral that the EU helps to protect European citizens from the negative effects of globalization. Finally, the 45.4% was neutral as regards the EU enables European citizens to benefit from the positive effects of globalization.

Effect of gender on views on the European Union

Gender does not significantly affect the image of the pupils on the European Union. The opposite is true in terms of pupils on the participation of Greece in the European Union. The boys believe that Greece's participation in the European Union is a positive for the country while girls said that it is negative.

The percentage of 50.7% of pupils said that Greece as a whole has benefited from being a member of the European Union. The 31.0% reported that she was harmed while 18.3% said that was neither benefited nor harmed. Finally, the 45.4% of pupils are neither optimistic nor pessimistic as to the EU's future, 33.0% were fairly or very optimistic, while 21.6% were fairly or very pessimistic.





If EU was a person how would she look like?

EU would be a middle aged beautiful woman, her clothes would be colorful and black, yellow and red would be the dominant one's. She would be like a mother with the arms open for her children.

Proposals to Policy Makers

The Academic Coordinator requested from the teachers from the participating schools to provide recommendations for proposals for policy makers regarding the introduction of the subject of European Studies in the secondary general and vocational curricula which will be drafted and forwarded to the Ministry of Education, Research and Religious Affairs.

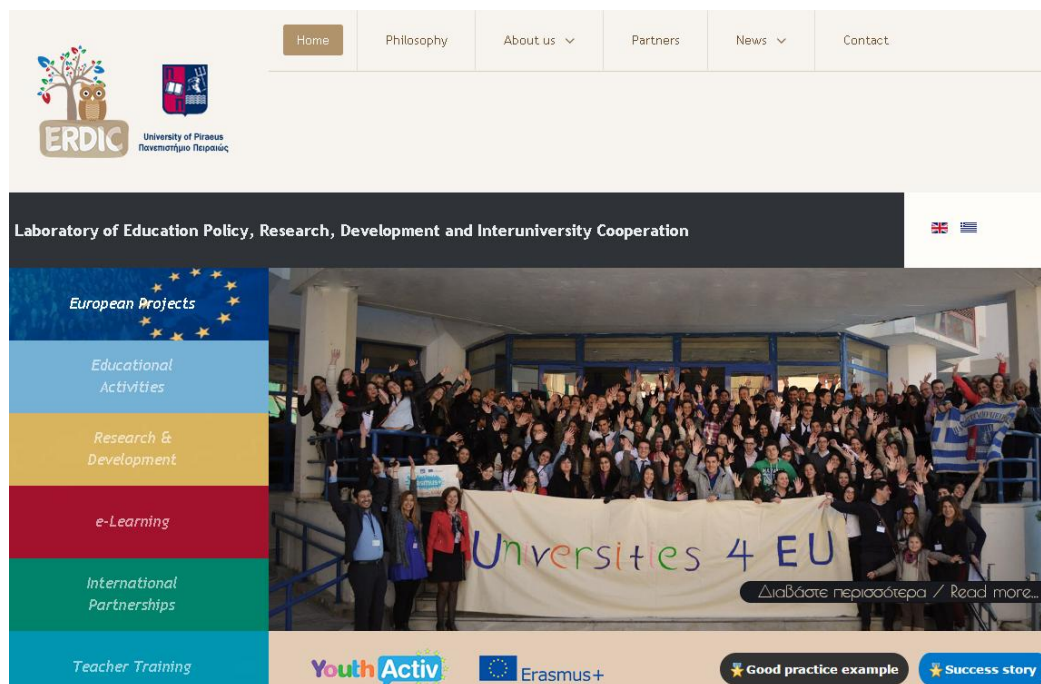
Their recommendations are the following:

- Interactive and artistic activities on European issues incorporated to the teaching curricula in secondary education in relevant courses like European history and culture.
- Inclusion of European interdisciplinary projects as well as extra new courses relevant to EU could be a proper way for the introduction of Lyceum Students to EU issues.
- Reorganisation of the teaching material and methodology based on a common European educational framework for the incorporation of subjects, chapters, books and courses of political science and European studies.
- Extra-curriculum activities designed to boost the social and intercultural skills of the pupils should be integrated to the common European educational framework.
- Training of the teachers on the value, the methodology and the material of the European studies is indispensable for the adequate introduction of EU issues in school education.

U4EU Sustainability

The sustainability of this project can be expressed from the following activities conducted during and after the project U4EU:

- 1. Establishment of the Laboratory of Educational Policy, Research, Development and Inter-University Cooperation (ERDIC)** [<https://erdic.unipi.gr/en/>].



A research Laboratory of the Department of International and European Studies of the University of Piraeus, was established in order to fulfill the gap on EU knowledge and research on Educational Policy, R&D and to enhance inter-university cooperation. The team of the ERDIC has a profound knowledge of the European policy agenda and educational programs and projects. The international scientific team of ERDIC consists of outstanding professors in European integration issues (<https://erdic.unipi.gr/en/erdic-en/about-us-en/bios-en>)

Its Director, Assistant Professor Foteini Asderaki has been the Academic Coordinator of four Jean Monnet Programmes during the academic years 2012-2016 and in particular: “Bringing Europe to School Teachers” through

which 125 Primary School Teachers from all over Greece have been trained in the field of European integration studies; “Europe at School through Art and

Simulation which trained 138 Primary Teachers”; YouthActiv which has been included among the “Jean Monnet success stories” by the European Commission in January 2016 and “Universities for EU (U4EU)”. ERDIC co-organizes the Teachers4Europe Ambassadors program concerning primary teachers and the Teachers4Europe program concerning secondary teachers in collaboration with the European Commission Representation in Greece. Moreover, it also co-organises the European Parliament School Ambassadors Program in collaboration with the European Parliament Office in Greece. In addition, ERDIC is a partner in Erasmus+ projects namely "DEMOKLEOS" Erasmus +, KA2, Strategic Partnerships and EDIPUS (2015-1-CY01-KA 203-011856) and the Jean Monnet project “The European Union’s Outermost Regions in the Caribbean and their Sovereign Neighbors – Between Regional Integration and External Alignments run by the University of Siegen (565391-EPP-1-2015-1-DE- EPPJMO-PROJECT).

The Office of the European Parliament in Greece in cooperation with the Department of Educational Broadcasting of the Ministry of Education, Research and Religious Affairs and the Laboratory of Education Policy, Research, Development and Interuniversity Cooperation (ERDIC) from the University of Piraeus with the support of the Representation of the European Commission in Greece are organizing the pilot program “EP school Ambassadors”. The program began on January 2016 and the schools selected to participate were 22 Lyceums that actively participated in the “U4EU” project.

The European Commission Representation Office in Greece supports the Teachers4Europe Ambassadors program concerning primary teachers and the Teachers4Europe program concerning secondary teachers. Every year teachers are trained and afterwards they implement an EU oriented project with their pupils in school. 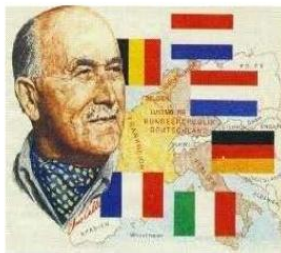
