Medieval and Modern History - Jean Monnet Chair “ad personam”

Professor Dr. Raphaëla Averkorn holds a Chair of Medieval and Modern History and a Jean Monnet Chair “ad personam” in European Integration History at the Department of History, Faculty I, University of Siegen, Germany. She is also the director of two international, interdisciplinary Master Programmes „Roads to Democracy(ies)“ and “International Cultural Studies”. She is the Erasmus Coordinator of the History Department (36 partner universities) and member of the teacher training center at the University of Siegen. She is former Vice Dean for Study Affairs, Finances and International Relations. She is a member of the Academic Senate and of its commission for teaching and study. She has been appointed permanent honorary visiting professor at the School of Political Theory, Department of International Relations, Zhejiang University, Hangzhou, China. Previously she worked during 14 years as Assistant Professor and later as Associate Professor at the University of Hannover, Germany.

She holds a First State Examination for High Schools in history, French language and literature, Spanish language and literature, educational science, political science (University of Münster, Germany), a Maîtrise d'Histoire (University of Bordeaux III, Michel de Montaigne, France), a PhD (University of Münster, Germany), a “Habilitation” (University of Hannover). She has received various international research grants and has gained international research and teaching experiences at universities e.g. in Armenia, Azerbaidshan, Austria, Belgium, Chile, China, Denmark, Finland, France, Georgia, Greece, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Uzbekistan, USA. She has worked during many years as a Bologna Promoter and Bologna Counsellor on national and European level. She works e.g. on European integration history, international relations, transcultural history, historiography, history of higher education and educational reform processes. She has published in German, English, French and Spanish. She is the coordinator of various international, interdisciplinary third-party funded research projects, projects on capacity building and projects on blended learning, school education (e.g. Tempus, Eastern Partnership, Jean Monnet, Network of Excellence, 6th Framework Programme for Research, Socrates, Erasmus+, Gerda Henkel-Stiftung, DAAD /Auswärtiges Amt). She is a member of international advisory boards in various research institutions and of various editorial and advisory boards in several countries (e.g. Belgium, France, Luxembourg, Portugal, Spain).
